The local postoffice is arranging to extend the delivery of mail by city carriers to Fourth Street West from F to H streets, and to such portion of West McCook as has been supplied with adequate sidewalks and crossings.

The service on new territory will begin on the 15th of February, and by order of the department no service will be extended where a suitable letter box or other receptacle for the mail is not provided.

Delivery by rural carriers has also been ordered to residents of South McCook who will erect rural letter boxes on the line traversed by the carriers, and the postmaster is endeavoring to have the route of Carrier M. S. Jimerson so changed as to be able to serve the greater part of that section of the city.

#### Would 'Twere True.

There is afloat a rumor that the big Culbertson irrigation ditch, for years the property of U. S. Senator Buckley of Connecticut, has been disposed of by the senator to Chicago parties, who will develop the ditch and advance a big land proposition with it. The price is stated as having been \$125,000, which is a mere fraction of the sum paid some years since by the senator for the big property.

In connection with this enterprise it is suggested that a dam may be built across the Blackwood creek between McCook and Culbertson, which will store water for use on the land north of the river west of this city and if it is ever realized will mean large things for McCook.
