Mattie Wilson left this week for a visit with relatives in Levant, Kas.

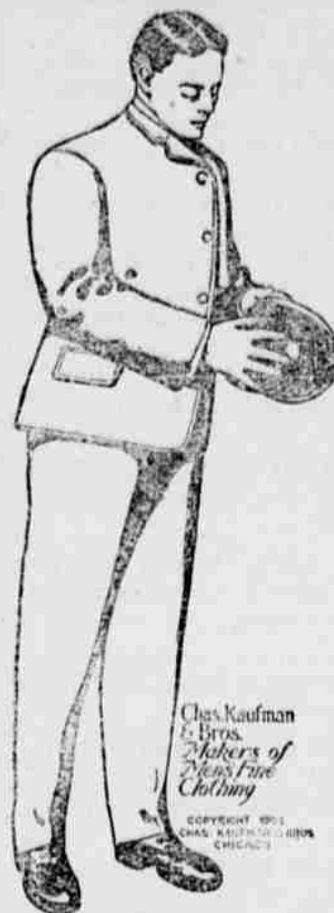
E. L. Sandusky and wife of Falls City were in this city over Sunday, guests of J. F. Walsh and family.
