Court House News.

Treasurer Zook and his assistants have been very busy men all week. Taxes are being paid to the extent of \$2,500 a day and the office force has been compelled to labor night and day to keep up with the work.

The Rock Island and Mo. Pac. railroads have paid their taxes in full though a portion of their tax was paid under protest. The Burlington tendered \$11,400.30 in full payment of their tax which this year has been increased to about \$17,500. The County Treasurer has refused to accept the tender.

Mr. Tanner, County Clerk has been taking it easy this week as the tax books are complete and there is nothing but routine business to require his attention. His office however, is a scene of activity as Messrs Hinton, McCray and Glosser special committee of the county board are looking up all delinquent personal tax since 1861. This committee has been hard at work and will probably be engaged the greater part of next week. Very little of this delinquent tax will be collected, but as the state has the county charged with its portion of the tax, the county will receive credit from the state for all uncollected taxes. This will materially reduce the county's debt to the state and is the purpose for which the committee was appointed.

But one new case, Jacob Mack vs. Jas. Graham, has been commenced in Chas. Loree's office in the last week. Charlie says the tales of wealth that were reported as a part of the district clerk's office are a delusion and a snare.

Call for Mass Meeting.

The committee appointed by the Falls City Commercial Club to look after the good roads question have decided to call a mass meeting at the Court house in this city on Tuesday December 13 at 2 p. m. at which all people in the county interested in the Good Roads question are urged to be present. The purpose of this meeting is to discuss this question and if possible to devise some means of securing the good roads for the entire county. It has also been suggested that such a gathering might frame a bill on this subject and have our members of the Legislature introduce it at the session of that body next winter.

Judge Munger of the U. S. district court has on application of the Burlington railroad issued a temporary restraining order enjoining all county treasurers from declaring the Burlington's tax delinquent or from attempting in any manner to collect the tax until the case can be heard.
