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**THE LIVE STOCK MARKET.**  
Latest Quotations from South Omaha and Kansas City.

**SOUTH OMAHA.**  
Union Stock Yards—Cattle—There was a light run of cattle and the market ruled active and a little stronger all around. The demand for good beef steers and packers seemed to be in good shape and as a result they bought up the cattle in good season. Beef steers brought a three sronger price and the market today was probably around a dime higher than on Tuesday, which was the low point of the week. The cow market was also in good shape and the prices paid looked a little stronger than yesterday. Packers all wanted a few and as the supply was light they had to pay a little more money than they did yesterday. In some cases sales were made that looked a dime higher, but the market could best be described by calling it strong and active. Bulls, calves and stags also sold more readily today though the prices paid did not show much change from yesterday. There were very few feeders on sale today and anything at all good brought strong prices. There is a fairly good demand from the country for choice cattle and the light supply makes them sell at good, strong prices. Common stuff, however, is rather neglected.

Hogs—There was about an average run of hogs and the market opened up steady with yesterday's close. The hogs began selling at \$3.15 and \$3.17, but the buyers all seemed to have liberal orders and a result sellers raised their hands. The market kept getting better and the packers bought the hogs as fast as they could get to them. After the first round sales were mostly at \$5.15 and \$5.20, and on the last they sold from \$5.20 to \$5.25. A few hogs sold at \$5.10 and \$5.12, so that the average cost is little lower. It was a good, active market from start to finish and everything had changed hands before 9 o'clock in the morning.

Sheep—The supply of sheep was about the same as yesterday and the market ruled steady to strong and active. Packers were all good buyers and as a result everything sold early. At 10 o'clock sheep and yearlings that sold yesterday for \$4.55 brought \$4.60 today. There were no lambs on sale as choice as yesterday, but considering the quality the market today was fairly steady. A few feeders were offered today and they also sold at very satisfactory prices.

**KANSAS CITY.**  
Cattle—Receipts, 4,500; steady to 10c up. Native beef steers, \$5.00 to \$5.25; stockers and feeders, \$3.75 to \$4.75; cows and heifers, \$3.25 to \$4.75; canners, \$2.25 to \$3.25; fed western steers, \$4.00 to \$4.65; bulls, \$3.00 to \$4.50; calves, \$4.50 to \$6.00.

Hogs—Receipts, 16,000; steady to 24c higher. Bulk of sales, \$5.25; mix and pack, \$5.20 to \$5.30; light, \$5.10 to \$5.20; pigs, \$4.00 to \$4.50.

Sheep—Receipts, 3,000. Lambs, \$5.25 to \$5.45; muttons, \$4.25 to \$4.40; sheep and yearlings mixed, \$3.50 to \$4.75; ewes, \$3.40 to \$3.55; culls, \$2.75 to \$3.25.

**READY TO LET BIG CONTRACT.**  
Navy Department Completes Its Revision Specifications.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 19—The board of naval construction today completed the revision of the specifications of the battleships with a view to bringing their total cost within the figures of the bidders. President Olcott and Judge Payson, representing the Newport News and Cramp companies, are prepared to accept the contracts for the ships at the board's terms. Moran Bros. of Seattle have notified Secretary Long of their purpose to accept the award in their case, so that although some technicalities remain to be disposed of in connection with the contracts the Navy department has practically concluded the task of allotting the greatest contract for naval construction work ever let in the history of the American navy.

If congress adopts the department's suggestion for new construction in the pending naval appropriation bill and provides for two more battleships and two more armored cruisers, it is the purpose of the Navy department not to prepare new plans but to invite bids on the plans used for the ships just contracted for. In this case a long step will be taken toward recovering the ground lost during the last year and a half in the effort to secure satisfactory designs for the big ships. The next step in the matter of construction in the opening of proposals for the building of six protected cruisers of the improved Olympia type, which will take place soon.

These vessels, being of a smaller pattern than the ships just contracted for it is expected that the older ship-building firms, and those new to the business who failed to secure a contract for armored cruisers or battleships, may contract within their ability, or it is doubtful if the larger concerns will be in a position to bid now for any of these craft in view of the amount of naval work they have on hand.

**NEVILLE'S CASE IS PECULIAR.**  
Physician Thinks There is Hope if Patient Can Be Removed to Florida.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Jan. 18.—The condition of Representative Neville is presenting some singular features. He had two slight hemorrhages yesterday and another light one this morning at 4 o'clock, yet his condition is apparently not growing more critical.

One lung is filled with blood and there is some danger of pneumonia, but his physician thinks this will probably be absorbed and he has no immediate fear of the hemorrhages proving fatal.

The patient is comparatively strong and the physician felt almost confident that if he can advance his condition slightly, so as to move him to Florida, he can save his life.

**Is Progressing.**  
WASHINGTON, Jan. 18.—The seate committee on finance today resumed its consideration of the bill for the reduction of the revenues collected under the war revenue act. When the meeting concluded the members of the committee announced that they were progressing with their work, but it was not concluded and there was no information to give to the public.

**Ships Ready but Not Called.**  
WASHINGTON, Jan. 19.—Nothing has been heard over night from Minister Loomis regarding the situation in Venezuela. Navy department officials deny that any instructions have been given to the North Atlantic squadron to move over from Florida to Venezuela. The ships, however, are in perfect cruising trim and could sail within a few hours after the receipt of orders, though it is not believed here that there will be any necessity for their movement toward Venezuela.
