Sanborn of the governor's staff and Adjutant General W. T. Seamans.

NOT MIGRATORY LOCUSTS. Mississippi's Grasshopper Plague Will Not

Endanger Other States. WASHINGTON, July 27 .- J. S. Hines of the entomological bureau of the agricultural department has returned from an inspection of the state of Mississippi, which has been suffering from the grasshopper pest. He found that the grasshoppers were largely confined to Bolivar county and that while they had done great damage to growing crops, they were of the nonmigratory species known as differentials and therefore were not likely to prove dangerous to other communities. The greatest damage has so far been done on the Dahomey plantation, where 300 acres of cotton in one patch was destroyed and 2,000 acres in another.


