Fannie Drake '05, has recently returned to school from a six weeks absence occasioned by sickness.



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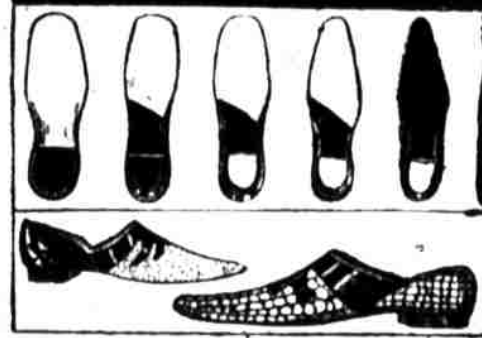
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
