We must be impartial in thought as well as in action, must put a curb upon our sentiments as well as upon every transaction that might be construed as a preference of one party to the struggle before another. My thought is of America. I am speaking, I feel sure, the earnest wish and parpose of every thoughtful American that this great country of ours, which is, of course, the first in our thoughts and in our hearts, should show herself in this time of peculiar trial a nation fit beyond others to exhiblt the fine poise of undisturbed judgment, the dignity of self-control, the efficiency of dispassionate action; a nation that neither sita in judgment upon others nor is disturbed in her own counsels, and which keeps herself fit and free to do what is honest and disinterested and truly serviceable for the peace of the world."Shall we not resolve to put upon ourselves the restraint which will bring to our people the happiness and the great losting influence for peac we covet for them?"
