Frank Perkins was then introduced. He showed by statistics that 74 per cent of the major college activities are carried on by fraternity men. He urged every freshman to affiliate himself with some college activity.

C. A. Sorensen closed the meeting with a short talk on the relation of freshmen to their home community. He declared that the University had no use for freshmen who tried to put on a certain haughtiness of manner to distinguish them from the non-fraternity men. He advised the Greeks when they go back to their community to spend more time in being agreeable and less time in seeking opportunities to display their fraternity pin.
