Just Returned From South America— Discussed Religious Life of the People in Southern Country.

Miss Shepard, who returned recently from South America, where she has

been working as a Y. W. C. A. secretary, spoke at the vesper service. She described first the up-to-dateness of Buenos Ayres and said that the cosmopolitanism makes a very great problem. Especially at the outbreak of the present war it was necessary to take measures to keep the representatives of the thirty nations from taking an active interest in the war. She spoke also of the large number of languages which every native family is able to speak. She spoke of the religious life and the need of overcoming atheism and bringing about a better moral condition.
