**DR. FISHER TO LECTURE TONIGHT**

First of Series of Lectures Given by Dr. Martin H. Fisher of the University of Cincinnati

Tonight at 8 o'clock, Dr. Martin H. Fisher of the University of Cincinnati will deliver the first of a series of lectures to students of the University of Nebraska. The lectures will be given in the Physics building on the University campus. Doctor Martin is professor of physiology in the University of Cincinnati, and his lectures will prove extremely instructive. He will deliver five lectures during this week and everyone is invited to attend. They will all deal with colloid chemistry in the service of biology and medicine.

Following is an outline of the lecture for this evening:  
Lecture 1—Febr. 8th at 8:00 p. m.

A. Water Absorption by Individual Cells and Tissues.

1. General Properties of Colloids.
2. Analogy Between the Swelling of Colloids and Protoplasm.
3. Biological Significance of This Analogy.
4. Criticism of the Current Theories of Water Absorption by Protoplasm.
