**PEOPLE OF FOREIGN BIRTH OVER SIXTEEN PER CENT**  
**Most Foreign Born Citizens Are Russians, With Germany in Second Place**

If the people of Lincoln ignored the president's neutrality proclamation and aligned themselves in accordance with original neutrality a war of many nations could be staged. The Russian contingent would number more than 3,351, the number of Lincoln people born in Russia, listed in the last census. The German contingent would number 1,197; the English, 453; French, 28, and Belgian, 7.

Fifty-nine and two-tenths per cent of the total population of Lincoln in 1910 was native born white and 22 7/10 per cent or 10,001 people were of foreign or mixed parentage. The foreign born whites totaled 7,200, or 16 4/10 per cent of the total population. Three Indians, four Chinese and three Japanese were listed.

The negro population of Lincoln has decreased considerably in recent years. In 1890, 1,360 negroes lived in Lincoln, the census report for 1900 showed only 814 and for 1910, 733.
