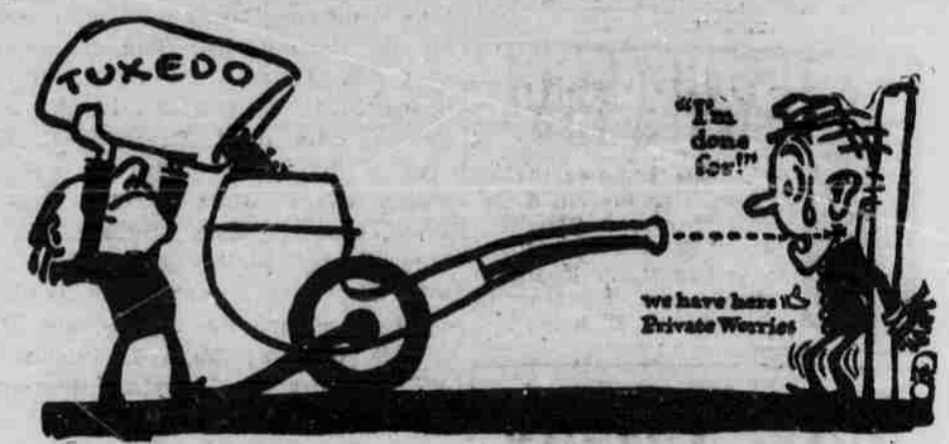
**HORT. DEPARTMENT

They are distributed to the various experiment stations for testing.
