AGGIES WIN FROM ENGINEERS 3 TO 1

BERGQUEST'S DELIVERY PROVES
HARD TO FATHOM

Selzer's Two-Bagger Quite Enough
for the Farmers to Win
the Game

Bergquest, who performed the slab duty for the Ags, held the Engineers down while his teammates walloped Crownover's delivery sufficiently to enable them to annex the long end of a 3 to 1 score in a dragging game on Nebraska field yesterday afternoon at 6 o'clock. Bergquest fanned ten men.

The Ags, batted first, Bullard registering the only hit, a measly single toward third. He died on second when Gibbons struck out for the third man.

Bergquest struck out the first three men that faced him. The Engineers could not locate him.

For the Engineers, two men got on base in the next half. Schumaker was hit by a ball and Crownover binged down the third base line, beating out the ball. Wagner ended the half with a strikeout.

On Keith's error at short, Johnson got to first. The Ags now started in with a vengeance. Zuhlke connected with the sphere and lined it out for three bases, scoring Johnson. Bergquest walked and Selzer doubled to left field, scoring Zuhlke and Bergquest. Withey batted out to the pitcher. Score: Ags, 3; Engineers, 0.

Bergquest fanned the next three men. It looked like a whitewash for the Engineers.

In the next half, the Engineers rallied, and a triple by Glazier followed by Olsen's double, brought in their lone tally. Bergquest tightened up and retired the side.

In the fifth inning, the gathering darkness impeded the players. The pitchers, too, had trouble in finding the plate, and two men were walked.

Ames won from Nebraska in the first varsity dual track meet last Saturday by the score of 59½ to 53½. A cold, heavy rain had so saturated the field that fast time was impossible, especially hindering the dashes and pole vault.

The Nebraska men won the following places:

100-yard dash—Scott, first; Irwin, second. Time: 10 3-5 seconds.
Mile run—Overman, third.
Discus—O'Brien, first. Distance: 109 feet, 8 inches.
120-yard hurdles—Bolton, third.
440-yard dash—Owen, first. Time: 53 3-5 seconds.
Pole vault—Liebendorfer tied with Blair of Ames for second.
Low hurdles—Wiley, second.
Shot put—Shaw, first. Distance: 139 feet, 8 inches.
Half mile run—Grau, third.
220-yard dash—Scott, first; Owen, second. Time: 22 4-5 seconds.
