TREASURER HALL HAS SAVED MONEY FOR THE UNIVERSITY

George E. Hall, state treasurer, who is a candidate for re-election, has Author of the Shumway Law-State adopted a policy in making collections aid to schools teaching agriculture from the county treasurers that is saving the University thousands of dollars a year. By compelling the county treasurers to pay their monies into the state fund monthly, warrants drawn upon the state University funds can be paid at once at par, and do not have to be redeemed later with inter-

> The state treasurer's report at the Capitol show that before Mr. Hall's administration, these amounts were paid out of the University fund for interest: In 1903-1904, \$84,46; 1907-1908, \$2.897.50; 1908-1910, \$11,047.36; 1911-1912, \$15,511,93; 1913-1914, \$10,523.96; December 1, 1914 to March 31, 1915, \$2,254.39. This amounts in all to \$40,318.60, that would have been paid to the University had Mr. Hall's method been adopted.

Mr. Hall has thus practically increased the University revenues by making it unnecessary to pay interest on the warrants. A similar saving has been made for the normal fund .- Po-
