who left at the time of the war emergency were given the averages that they had made up to that time. Alpha Gamma Rho, agricultural fraternity, was not included in the list, as it was maintaining no house last year.

A marked increase in the averages was shown over the first semester, and there were far less delinquencies, failures and conditions. The average

index for fraternities the first semester was 168; percentage of conditions, failures and delinquencies, 11.3. In the second semester the figures were 191.3 and 6.5. For the sororities the first semester figures were 267.8 and 2.3 and for the second semester 262 and 2.2.
