HALF DOZEN WAR FILMS
FOR NEBRASKA THEATRES

State Auxiliary Committee in
Receipt of Important Pic-
tures to Be Shown Soon

The auxiliary motion picture committee of the Nebraska state council of defense of which W. H. Ferguson is chairman has received six reels of the "Official United States War Films," to be shown throughout the country.

These films will be shown at the Orpheum, and possibly at the Oliver. Later they will be sent to towns throughout the state for showing.

The purpose of the films are to acquaint citizens of Nebraska more thoroughly with the many forms of work going on in the department of war and help them to realize the difficulties which are met constantly.

The idea of showing official war films originated with President Wilson, who wanted to put before the public, pictures that would be censored by ordinary picture film companies. The films are put out by a special committee on war publication and are sanctioned by President Wilson.
