MANUALS OF MILITARY INSTRUCTION TO CADETS

Issued to Non-Commissioned Officers and Privates—Has English-French Vocabulary

At the officers' drill Tuesday afternoon the non-commissioned officers were issued copies of the "Manual for Non-Commissioned Officers and Privates of Infantry." This book is published by the war department for non-commissioned officers and privates in the United States army, being also prescribed for engineer companies and coast artillery companies. It contains information useful to practically any man connected with the army, and especially for lower branches of the service.

Much of the material has been obtained from the "Infantry Drill Regulations," a manual used last year in the winter inside instruction at the University, and also material from the "Manual of Interior Guard Duty." In the last chapter, an English-French vocabulary, containing many of the most common words, and phrases, makes the book especially complete at this time.

WOMEN CALLED UPON TO MAKE MORE SACRIFICES

Speakers at Tuesday Vespers Repeat Decisions Reached at Crete Conference

Helen Minor presided at Vespers Tuesday afternoon in the Y. W. C. A. rooms in the Temple. The girls, who went to Crete to the Y. W. C. A. conference, gave an account of the meetings held there.

Evelyn Black told how necessary it was that the women should make themselves worthy of the sacrifice which the men are making. We must have four things, she said, first, 200,000 students enlisted in the study of Christian principles, second, a call to decision for the right; third, an adequate number of men and women for foreign missionaries and fourth, a half million dollars to carry on the work.
