French War Orphan Fund Being Subscribed in State
Thirteen additional adoptions of French war orphans have been reported for the two weeks ending February 21, 1918, by Max Westermann, treasurer Lincoln committee for the French war orphan fund. This makes a total of 419 adoptions to date. The total collections and pledges amount to \$23,180.31 of which \$547.50 has been subscribed since the last report.
