ected the language situation since there are so many trained German teachers and so few for French and Spanish. Much work can be done by students of other languages by this intensive study.

Classes will be organized in required subjects for the teachers' professional certificate and all teachers desiring such a course are asked to write the acting director of University extension, Prof. A. A. Reed, as soon as possible, giving such facts as to training and experience as to aid him in giving advice.

The requirements for admission correspond to those of the semestral sessions as in the general table of entrance requirements.

**Offers Agricultural Work**

The college of agriculture offers work to superintendents, principals and teachers interested in the promotion of agricultural education in the rural schools.

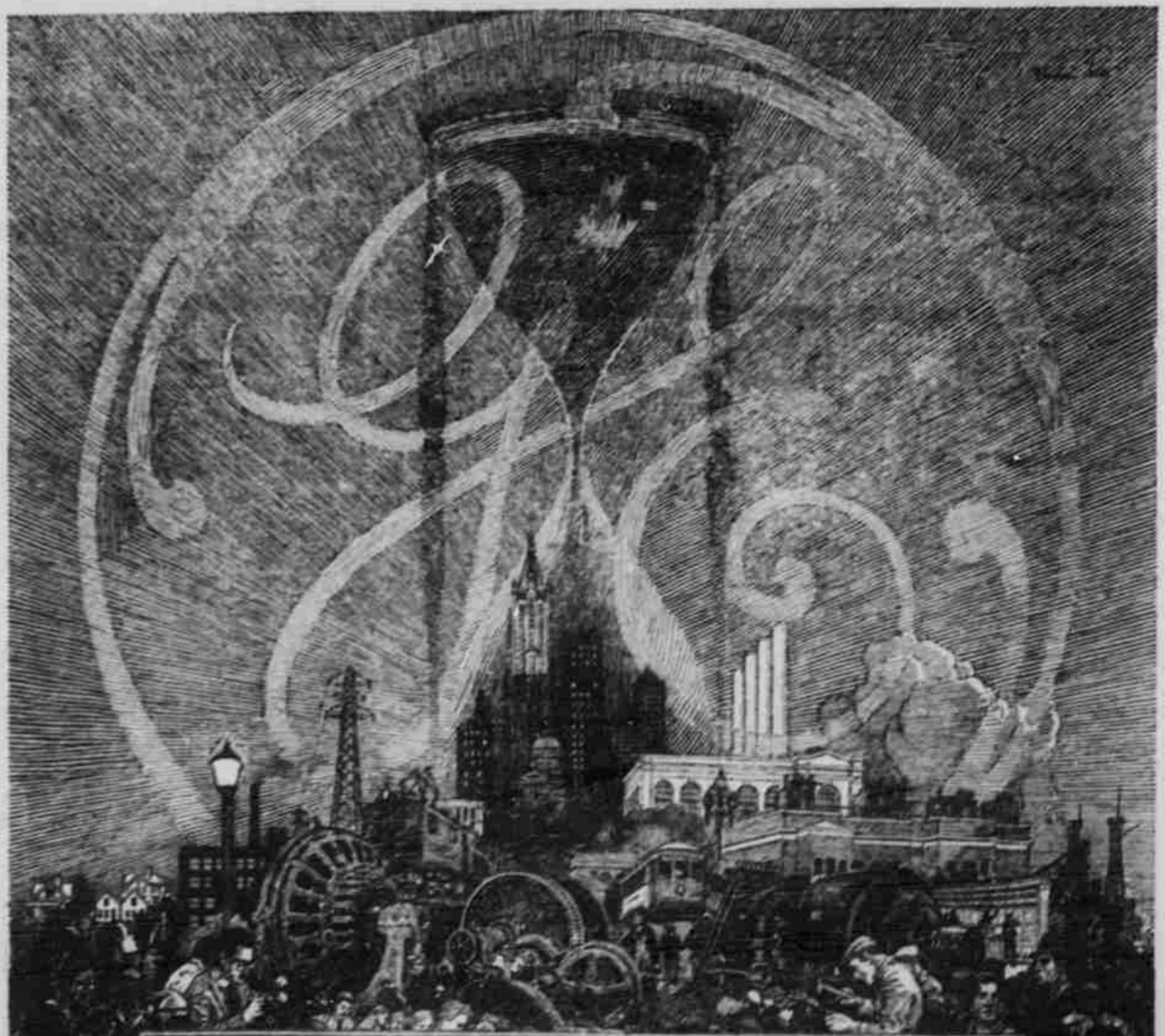
