DIRECTORY AND HANDBOOK PART OF Y. M. C. A. WORK

Books Are Biggest Helps to
Students—Rooms Open
To All

The University Young Men's Christian Association issues two publications each year. The Students' Handbook a pocket guide of information and for diary and memorandum, is distributed to the students free of charge at the beginning of each school year. Last fall 800 Handbooks were published. The University Directory contains the name, course and year in school, home town, Lincoln address and telephone number of each student, similar information in regard to the faculty, and a list of all organizations of the University with officers. This year 1,200 directories were sold at the cost of publication.

The Y. M. C. A. room is open to all men of the school from 7 o'clock to 10 o'clock. Here they may read, rest, study or play games, as they choose. There are many magazines for the use of the students; among them are seven weeklies, thirteen monthlies and two quarterlies, besides a morning and evening city paper and a metropolitan daily. With but few exceptions these periodicals are not to be found in the University library. After the magazines have become two weeks old they are sent to the Y. M. C. A. huts at the army camps.

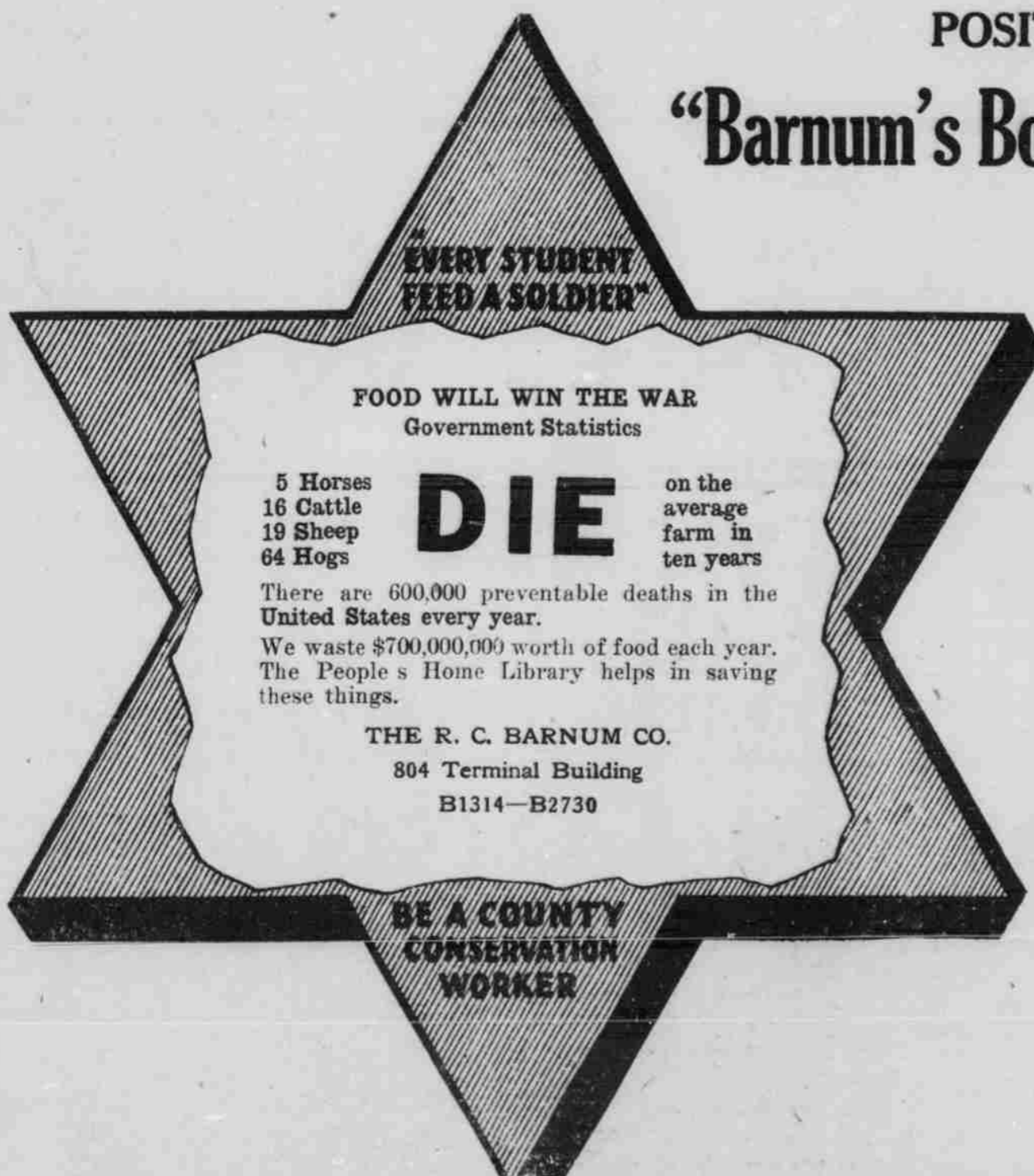
