

GOVERNMENT PLAN FOR S.A.T.C. MAKES CAMPUS A MILITARY CAMP

Government to Train Nearly 2,000 a provisional contract with the Government. Soldiers on University This contract provides that the Uni-Grounds

Captain E. J. MacIvor Military Director in Charge of Entire Program

Following the establishment early in the summer of a unit of the Student Army Training Corps at the University of Nebraska, officials here have been hard at work making provisions for the two thousand men who are expected to enlise in this branch.

Although complete plans for housng, feeding and instructing members t this new division have not yet been) tade authorities here have gone ahead and made temporary provisions for the incoming applicants so that immediate organization of the corps upon establishment of uniform plans by the government will be possible vhen final arrangements have been 1 nade.

When notice was given the Univerily early in the summer that this division would be established here. Dean G. R. Chatburn was appointed a impaign director of the State of Nebraska. In his new position Dean Chathurn at once began a campaign whereby complete information regardof victories to his credit in all ng the S. A. T. versity authorities shall provide for the housing, subsistence and instruction of soldiers on a basis of \$1 per day for each man for housing and subsistence with provisional allowance for costs sustained in instructing the men and otherwise carrying out a complete military and educational program.

The permanent contract will take into account all extra costs that have been sustained by the institution in carrying out the temporary contract and will probably specify the fees to be charged for applicants. Tuition fees will therefore probably be made to cover only the exact operating expenses of the University in handling each member of the S. A. T. C. until he is inducted into the government service from which time his entire expense will be assumed by the gov ernment.

Housing Presents Problem

Apparently the most perplexing problem now confronting both University authorities and Captain Mac-Ivor is that of housing the men of this corps. Many suggestions have been offered as a solution to this question but no practical arrangements seem possible for the short time left within which to make provision,
