All senior girls meet in Law 101, Thursday at 11 a. m. to discuss plans for Ivy Day. Important meeting, all come.

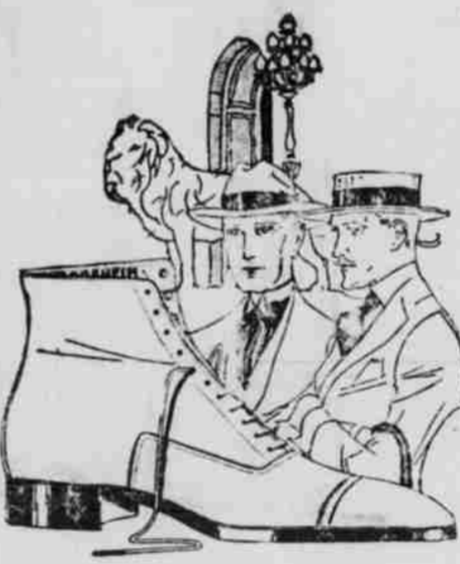
**Lost Articles**
