LYMAN ADDRESSES UNIVERSITY STUDENTS

SAYS RELIGION AND EDUCATION NECESSARY TO SOLVE WORLD PROBLEMS

"The idea that education will solve all the problems in the world is wrong." declared Dr. Lyman, speaking at the mid-week meeting of the University Y. M. C. A. at the Temple, Wednesday night. "It wont do it alone, but only when combined with religion." This, he asserted, was shown when Germany, the most high ly educated country in the world, committed attrocities in war that would put an Indian to shame.

"Leaders of men are those who are deeply religious, strong morally, and have their spiritual welfare at heart, such as Roosevelt and W. J. Bryan," he said. He cautioned (reshmen not to overdue science. "A great scientist has said that scientists are the most narrow of men. They believe only that which they can see, hear or touch." he stated. "If, when you are a senior, you want advice and sympathy you won't go to the highly trained men of the university," he said. "You will go to a man, who although he may not hold such a high position, will be one from whom you may expect sympathy. An educated man is a good man only when he combines religion with his education.

Prof. A. A. Reed and Charles Fordyce attended the Saunders county institute for teachers last Saturday. The former talked on the high school curriculum and the latter on educational measurements.
