**BRADFORD ADDRESSES AGRICULTURAL CLUB**

"Vocational Education" was the subject chosen by Principal H. E. Bradford, of the School of Agriculture, in an address before the Agricultural Club, Thursday evening, in Social Science 101.

"This new system of education," he declared, "is but the result of the growth of an idea. Just recently we have begun to believe that we should pay for vocational education. But how?"

"The Smith-Hughes bill in 1914 provided for the teaching of agriculture in the public schools. Part of the money is set aside for the Agricultural Colleges, and part for the training of teachers. In the University of Nebraska we have at the present time 75 male students who are being educated under the Smith-Sears bill, which provides for the vocational education of soldiers who were rendered physically unfit during the war.

"The percentage of teachers of agriculture in the colleges has not increased as fast as that in the high schools. In '20 about \$100,000 will be distributed among the schools. The movement is gaining rapidly, and I predict that in five years we shall have at least one hundred schools in the state operating under the Smith-Hughes plan.

Following the address by Principal Bradford, which the Ag Club greatly appreciated, business was taken up, chief among which was the Farmers' Fair, which is to be held Saturday, April 10. The Ag mixer, to be held Saturday, March 20, at the Armory, was announced.
