WRESTLING MATCH.

Saturday night will be the first opportunity to see the Nebraska wrestlers in action. Last year the Cornhusker mat men brought honor to the school by winning several dual meets. This year's schedule is one of the heaviest ever undertaken by the University. The Varsity team not only will feature in a number of meets with Missouri Valley schools but will also take part in the Western Intercollegiate meet which will be held at the University of Indiana in March. In this meet Nebraska will meet the largest schools in the country. The squad will have its first test when it meets the local Y. M. C. A. team Saturday. United student support is needed to keep Nebraska on the wrestling map.

HONOR IN EXAMINATIONS.

During the next week the honor of the students will be on trial. Final examinations are a serious matter and in proportion to their seriousness is the temptation to cheat. Authorities are stressing the importance of honesty more this year than ever before. Great precaution is being taken to remove temptation from students. If any are caught cheating, they will suffer serious consequences.

The spirit opposed to cheating prevails among the students as well as the members of the faculty. The fact that the honor spirit plan was voted down last year does not indicate that the student body is in favor of cheating; it merely indicates that they thought the plan impractical. The conversation of students shows that cheating is constantly growing in disfavor. Not only is it against the rules to cheat, but it is not the style.
