With her curls piled high on her head, Lillian of the Sighs seems to radiate a new and wondrous beauty. Richard Barthelmess is always interesting, not merely because he is a finished actor and good to look at, but because he is a Lincoln boy, whose true surname is Hutchinson. Mary Hay, the little wife of Mr. Barthelmess in real life. shows promise of becoming a screen favorite with her genuine characterization of the professor's sweetheart.
