NEBRASKA GRADUATES WRITE FROM COLUMBIA

Former Editors of Daily Nebraskan Describe Their Work in Eastern School

Recent letters from Howard Murfin, '21, former editor of the Daily Nebraskan, assistant to Prof. M. M. Fogg, of the Department of Journalism and member of the reportorial staff of the Lincoln Daily Star, tell of his appointment on the staff of the Journal of Commerce in New York City. Murfin has been attending the school of journalism at Columbia University for the past few months and during the summer was placed in charge of the study room in this department.

When Mile. Suzanne Lenglen, the French tennis wizard, was in America on her ill-fated tour, Murfin had charge of the publicity of her trip through the American Lawn Tennis Association.

Gaylord Davis, '20, former assistant accounting professor at Nebraska University, is also at Columbia, where he is acting as instructor of accounting. It is not known how long these former Cornhusker students will remain in the country's metropolis, but Murfin says he expects to return to Nebraska in the near future and enter the field of country journalism.
