

## FACULTY VISITORS RULED BY BUGLES

University Instructors at R. O. T. C. Camp Must Pile Out Bright and Early

FORT SNELLING, Minn., July 26—University faculty representatives who are visiting the R. O. T. C. camp at Fort Snelling where some 400 students from their institution are in camp, have been living by the bugle the last few days.

They get up to the notes of reveille and they have dinner when mess call sounds. They don't have to be soldierly, but since the rest of the camp has been regulated by the bugle, the college professors have followed suit.

They are here to see the kind of work that is being done by the students of Arkansas, Missouri, Kansas, Iowa, Minnesota, Nebraska and the Dakotas who are attending the camp, and to confer with the army officers on problems affecting the R. O. T. C. Among those attending is Chancellor S. Avery of the University of Nebraska.

Pistol and automatic rifle firing tactics, musketry and athletic events are the chief subjects on the students' schedule now. Tests of the students are being conducted as to their proficiency in the various subjects.

Among the students who are to receive commissions as second lieutenants in the infantry officers reserve corps upon completion of the camp is Ernest B. Johnson of Holdrege, Nebr.
