WOMEN MAY OBTAIN NINE FELLOWSHIPS

Applications Must be Made Before February First to the Fellowship Chairman

The American Association of University Women has announced nine fellowships available for the academic year 1923-1924. Applications and recommendations must be received not later than February 1, 1923, and should be sent to Professor Margaret E. Malby, Barnard College, Columbia University, New York City.

Application is made by a letter to the chairman of the Committee on Fellowships. The letter of application should contain an account of the applicant's educational training, a statement in full of the plan of study or research, and the object in view. It should be accompanied by:

- 1. A certificate from the registrar of the college or university awarding the degree or degrees received by the applicant.
2. Date of birth; testimonials as to the health, character, personality, ability, and scholarship of the applicant.

These, papers, or reports of investigations, published or unpublished, unless other requirements are specified.

The committee cannot assume any responsibility for collecting testimonials for an applicant.

These, papers and letters submitted by the applicant will be returned if postage is sent for that purpose. Confidential letters sent to the committee are retained; but if an unsuccessful applicant wishes to make use of them in applying for a fellowship elsewhere, they will be sent to the chairman of the Committee on Fellowships, provided these testimonials are regarded as confidential.

The acceptance of a fellowship implies the obligation on the part of the fellow to devote herself unreservedly to study or research as outlined in her application; to submit

any proposed change in her plan to the chairman for approval; and to send to the chairman at least two reports on her work, one not later than March 1, 1924, and the other upon the completion of her year's work.

The Committee on Fellowships of the American Association of University Women has been made the committee on award of this Fellowship, of the value of from one thousand to twelve hundred dollars, offered annually. It is available for research in physics, chemistry or biology.

This Fellowship is open to American women holding the degree of Doctor of Philosophy or Doctor of Science who give promise of distinction in the subject to which they are devoting themselves.

The committee in charge of the Sarah Berliner Fund desires to give explicit recognition to those candidates who can carry on research and at the same time have the privilege of giving one or more courses or lectures at some university or institution of learning.

This Fellowship of one thousand dollars for research in Europe, is open to any woman having a degree in Arts, Science, or Literature, who has met all the requirements for the Doctor of Philosophy degree with the

possible exception of the completion of the dissertation. This Fellowship will be awarded only to one who gives promise of distinction.

Anna C. Brackett Memorial Fellowship

This memorial Fellowship of seven hundred and fifty dollars is offered in alternate years in the American Association of University Women as trustee of the memorial fund given by the Anna C. Brackett Association.

This Fellowship is open to any woman having a degree in Arts, Science or Literature, who intends to make teaching her profession. In general, preference is given to those applicants who have had successful experience in teaching and in addition have completed at least two

years of graduate study. The award is based upon evidence of character and ability of the candidate and promise of success in teaching.

Latin-American Fellowship

This Fellowship of one thousand dollars is established by the American Association of University Women to further friendly relations with women students of the Latin-American republics, and to assist them to prepare for public service in their communities.

The qualifications for candidates for this Fellowship are:

- 1. They must be natives of the Latin-American republics.
2. They must have the equivalent of a college education in the university.
