of Foreign Students**

"European students, especially the Teutonic, lack the enthusiasm, vivacity, and sophistication of the American student," declared Professor John R. Knipping of the department of European history. In his lecture at the monthly history conference held in the American history and political science seminar room. His subject was "Graduate Study in Belgian Universities and at Sorbonne."

Professor Knipping spent two years studying in Paris and in Belgium. He was the first American to receive a degree from the University of Ghent and has received publicity in several European and American magazines for valuable research work. In addition to his discussion of students, the speaker gave brief personal sketches of prominent professors in Belgian and French universities.

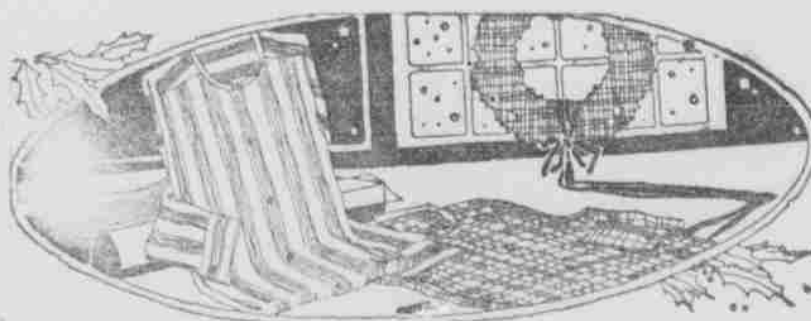

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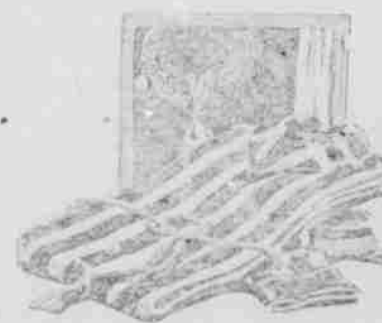
