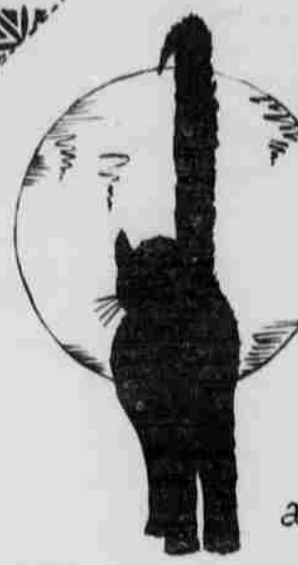


**Buckle Your Galoshes!**

**In the College World.**

Intercollegiate debate judges have been abolished by Iowa State College and Drake for their contest at Ames, February 17. This plan, which Iowa and Nebraska started in 1920, is now pretty generally followed by mid-west universities.

A course in truth-telling has been added to the University of Pennsylvania curriculum to inculcate common honesty. The Associated Advertising Clubs are backing the project to get the cooperation of school boys, teachers and public welfare institutions in saving the people of the country millions of dollars by feeling that truth-telling prevails in advertising stock promotion, manufacturing and retailing.

A "Bone Dry" club to promote enforcement of the Eighteenth Amendment has been organized by University of South Dakota students.

To the University of Missouri annual homecoming celebration not only have alumni but the people of the state generally are invited. Over 25,000 have been entertained this year.

Brigadier-General Ulysses Grant McAlexander, known as the "Rock of the Marne," spoke to students of Kansas State University at convocation. His topic was an account of what stopped the advance of the Germans at the Marne.

A radio concert, broadcasted from Kansas City, was received at the Engineering building of the State Agricultural College, and broadcasted over the entire campus as a feature of Engineers' Week.

Seven eastern colleges will compete against Dartmouth in the intercollegiate snow sport meet, to be held as a feature of Winter Carnival. The contest is in ski jumping and races.

Money for the Memorial Stadium is being received from interested alumni all over the country and the fund is growing fast.

A special train was run from Denver to carry students to the Denver University-Colorado State basketball game. Many students took advantage of this.

A publicity bureau was installed at the University of California purposing to control the collection and distribution of all news concerning the activities of students in campus affairs.
