SEMI-FINALS PLAYED TODAY IN TOURNEY

Companies H and M Win in-Final Games of Second Round in Military Tourney.

The second round of the inter-company military basketball tournament was completed yesterday afternoon when the Company M cagesters defeated the Company H tossers 21 to 16, and the Company H five trimmed the Company I quintet, 22 to 15. The semi-finals will be played Friday at 5 o'clock.

An interesting feature of the Company M-Company L game was the fact that the Company L cage artists failed to score a single point during the first half, but came back strong in the second period and scored sixteen points to Company M's five tallies. The Company M team had piled up a big lead in the first half, however, and so the Company L basketballers lost, 21 to 16. Company H had a fairly easy time winning from Company I, leading at the end of the half, 15 to 8, and finishing with a 22 to 15 advantage.

The semi-finals, which are to be played today at 5 and 8 o'clock, will be between Companies C and D, and Companies H and M. This quartet of Companies is represented by some fast cage teams, and two well-fought court battles are expected. The games will be played in twenty-minute halves.

NEBRASKA TIED FOR THIRD IN ASSOCIATION

Huskers and Hoosiers Each Have Scored Three Victories and One Defeat.

Nebraska is tied with Indiana for third place in the Western Intercollegiate Wrestling Association. Ames and Ohio both have an unbroken sequence in the win column.

Indiana and Nebraska have each lost one meet, and won three. From the view of points made in these matches, however, Nebraska ranks ahead of the Hoosiers. Cornhusker matmen have run up a total of 73 points against 31 by their opponents. Indiana has a score of 60 against their opponent's 42.

Ames ranks above Ohio in view of points won and lost. Each team has won five games. The Iowa Ags have 122 points as against 16 by their opponents. Eleven of these 16 points

were secured by Nebraska. Ohio has a score of 99 1-2 to 29 1-2.

In meets held last week, Ohio won from Indiana 14 to 11. Ames beat Wisconsin 20 to 5.
