The first party of Cornhusker tracksters which will compete in the Drake Relays Friday and Saturday will leave this afternoon at one o'clock on the Rock Island. Coach Schulte is taking the following eight athletes with him today: Oris Hatch, Sed Hartman, Slim Baldwin, Ed Crecelius, Sling Parks, Howard Turner, Chick Hartley and Adolph Wenke. These men will compete in the preliminary heats on Friday in the special events of the Des Moines athletic carnival.

The other party of Cornhusker cinder path artists entered in the relays with Manager Stephen King in charge will leave Friday at one o'clock, due to the fact that all relay races will be held Saturday afternoon. The following Husker relay teams are entered in the Drake classic, quarter-

mile relay team, half-mile relay team, mile relay team, and two-mile relay team. Because of the lack of proper training facilities, Coach Schulte has been unable to develop his four-mile team, and so he will not compete a four-mile team Saturday.
