**Lower Rates on Rent-A-Fords**

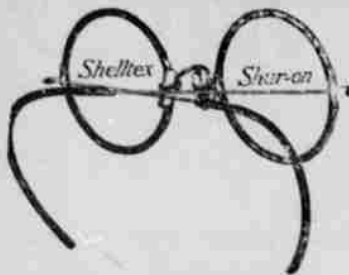
We now announce a new low rate on drive yourself Fords. At the request of a large number of our patrons, we have adopted the low time and mileage combination charge.
