RECORDS are being made every day on the new cinder track under the east stadium stands. Whipperman, sprinter from the "Show-me" state, holds the lap record of 31 2-5 seconds. The cinder track, which is approximately seven laps to the mile, is proving satisfactory to Husker tracksters, despite the fact that they have to run uphill at the south end of the track and downhill at the north end.

"KING" LEAR, Omaha medic trackster who has been topping the timbers for Coach Schulte for the past two seasons, is married. Just what effect this will have on Lear's track activities has not yet been determined. It is hoped in the Husker camp, however, that the Omaha athlete, who clears the hurdles in perfect form, will compete again this season.

"MUD" GARDNER, captain of the 1924 Husker track team, is expected to do great things in the half-mile this year. Gardner took first place in the half at both the indoor and outdoor valley meets last year. His record for this event is 1:56.8. An accurate picture of Gardner running

The Tiger runners defeated the Huskers in this event last year and the Huskers are out for revenge.
