**WORK BEGINS ON NEW GOLD STORE BUILDING**

Preliminary Work Already Begun—To Be Rushed to Completion.

Another milestone was reached in the development of commercial Lincoln when workmen yesterday began the work preliminary to demolishing the old building at O and Eleventh streets on the southwest corner, to make room for a substantial department store building, designed by Davis & Wilson, architects.

This six-story structure, 75x142 feet, modern Gothic design, will be of reinforced concrete construction, with facing of gray granite terra cotta. A building permit has already been issued to the Olson Construction company, who are in charge of the razing of the old landmark and the erection of the modern store building which will replace it.

"The new building," said Mr. Gold, has been carefully designed to meet the demands of a store catering to the popular want of the people and while no effort has been spared to include every modern improvement and shopping convenience, the building will be modest in equipment. In short, an up-to-date store erected to efficiently and economically distribute the type of merchandise and service a modern community such as Lincoln demands."
