The National Conference of Meth-
odist students has sent out a letter
urging that every university in the
United States be represented at this
conference. Nebraska is asked to
select two delegates, to be chosen by
the Methodist group.

The Methodists will decide whether
the north and south branches of
their church should be united. There
will be prominent leaders from each
division.

At the conference both experts
and students will present the various
fields of the church, showing what
they offer in the way of service,
what they are doing to meet the de-
mands made upon them and what the
possibilities are. This conference
has been called by students and is
under student leadership.
