HUSKERS WIN AT OLYMPIC TRYOUTS

Nebraskans Take Two of Eight Titles at Mid-Western Amateur Contest.

M'INTYRE AND SCOTT TAKE FIRST PLACES

Two boxers upheld the honor of Nebraska University and college athletics in general when they won two of the eight first places in the mid-western amateur Olympic tryouts at the Omaha Athletic club Tuesday night. Dorsey McIntyre won in the middleweight class, while Homer Scott was master of the heavyweights. Both won by decisions.

Four college men, three Omaha Athletic club boxers and one unattached man won in the eight classes. Besides the two Nebraska victories, Iowa State college and Parson's college each placed a man on the squad that is to try out in the semi-final Olympic tryouts to be held in Kansas City, Mo., April 19 and 20.

Forty-five Entries.
There were forty-five entries in the meet, thirty-two of whom were fighting under the O. A. C. colors. McIntyre, weighing 158 pounds, won his decision over George Barna, O. A. C. Homer Scott, tipping the scales at 185 pounds, won his decision from Paul Elias, Columbus, Neb.

Lightweight—Royal Coffman, O. A. C., stopped Frank Kroger, University of Nebraska, in first round.
Welterweight—J. J. Higgins, O. A. C., won decision over Oscar Thies, University of Nebraska.
Middleweight—Dorsey McIntyre, University of Nebraska, won decision from George Barna, O. A. C.
Light-heavyweight—Frank Clappitt, Iowa State college, stopped Robert Brink, O. A. C., in first round.

Heavyweight—Homer Scott, University of Nebraska, won decision from Paul Elias, Columbus, Neb.

HUSKER NINE BREAKS EVEN WITH MISSOURI

The Cornhusker baseball squad broke even on its two-game series with the University of Missouri on Monday and Tuesday. The first game gave the Huskers a 4 to 2 victory and the second a 4 to 2 defeat. The two Missouri runs in the first game were brought in by a homerun hit. Petersen pitched the winning game.

The team played Missouri University yesterday and will arrive home this morning. Out of the eleven

games scheduled for their southern trip, they won three and lost four. Three games were not played because of rain.
