HOLD FINAL TRYOUTS FOR KANSAS RELAYS

Events Are Run On Indoor Track; Locke Wins One Lap Race.

Final tryouts to determine what Husker tracksters will compete in the University of Kansas relay carnival, at Lawrence, Kas., April 19, were held at the stadium Tuesday afternoon. Due to the cold weather the tryouts were held on the indoor track, although the new cinder track is rapidly being worked into excellent shape for the coming track meets.

The main event of yesterday's performance was a special one lap race, which Locke won in 29 seconds, breaking the old record of 29:1 held by Red Layton. The speedy North Platte athlete also won the 100 yard event.

Results of the tryouts were:

100 yards, Locke, 11:1 seconds.

Broad jump, Hatch, 21 feet, 8 3-4 inches.

Half mile, Higgins, 2:07 4-10 seconds.

50 yards, Beerkle, 5 4-10 seconds.

The track team will be seriously handicapped in the coming meets, by

the absence of Whipperman, quarter and a half miler, who has been having serious trouble with an abscessed jaw.
