WILL PUBLISH SONGS FROM KOSMET SHOW

A block of seats will be reserved for students from the Lincoln campus.

Four of the principal songs of the 1924 Kosmet Klub production, "The Wishing Ring," will be published in song form by Cyril L. Coombs, author of the musical comedy. The four songs which will be sold are "The Wishing Ring," the theme song of the play, "All Day Long," "Dear Ole Virginia," and "When I Waltz With You."

The plan used last year in the 1923 Kosmet show of printing the songs

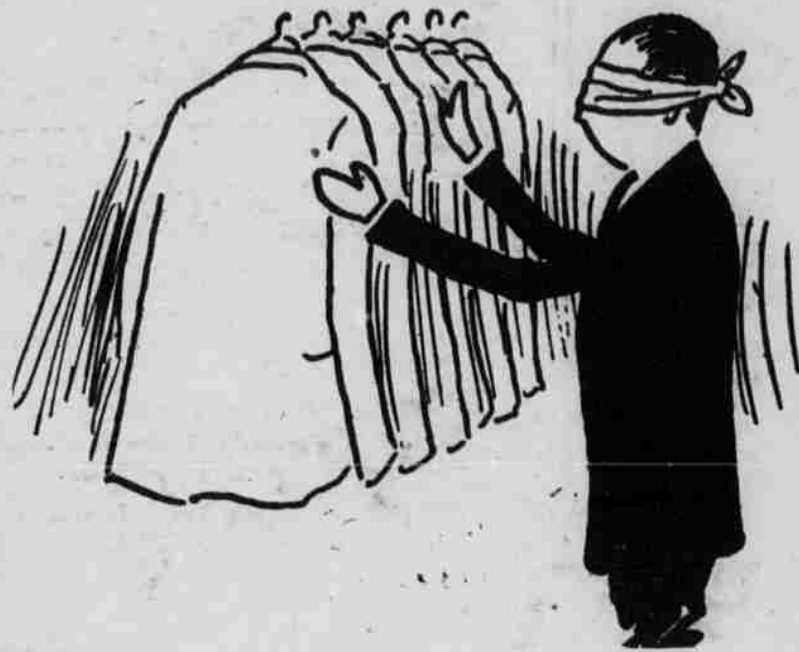
in a booklet will be abandoned this year. Each song will be printed separately so that student desiring them can purchase only those they want. The price of the songs will be thirty cents each.
