much of a statesman as an officer of the law, if we may judge by the speaker's experience with one he talked to particularly. The "peeler" was able to discuss current political topics with a fluency and grasp of facts that would have done credit to a member of parliament.

The possibility of the abolition of the monarchy is a very slight one, according to Mr. Jones' observation. Sir Evelyn Wrench, an eminent English newspaper man, made the statement that if a vote were taken on this question, 95 per cent of the people would be in favor of retaining the king. For the great mass of the English people, the king is the symbol of their country and their political institutions, and they are willing to retain the royal family for this reason, although it is a very expensive institution.

Attitude Toward Nobility Changes.
 Toward the nobility, the attitude of the people is changing rapidly. So many professional politicians and cheap yellow journalists are buying their way to titles that they are becoming less valuable in the eyes of the people. The illustration of yellow journalist who specializes in racy divorce proceedings as subject matter for his paper and who has been raised to a peerage for such distinguished services was commented upon by the speaker.

A short description of a session of parliament was one of the features of the talk. The extreme formality of the sessions and the clear and forceful speeches of the members were two of the salient features which attracted the attention of the visitor. Lady Astor was "prodded" by some of the speakers at various times but she always managed to get the better of her inquisitor by prompt and effective replies.

Mr. Jones' letters from abroad have been recently published in book form in response to the requests of numerous readers of the State Journal.

Other special lectures in political science have been given this semester by Frank Harrison and by County Attorney Matson. There will be at least one more talk given by some prominent Lincoln man before the close of the year on some other phase of practical government.

Portraits of Lincoln Persons Are Displayed

Several portraits of prominent Lincoln persons will be found in the exhibits of oils shown at the art gallery this week by the Lincoln Artists Guild. This organization is composed of about fifty local artists and art enthusiasts and the exhibit is the work of the members of the guild. 
