KEEPING TRACK OF THE HUSKERS

Reviewing again some points of the Missouri Valley indoor meet that were overlooked in the excitement of the Nebraska victory, Nebraska men finished well near the qualifying mark in the races that did not bring points for the Nebraska team. Ross finished sixth in the mile run out of a starters line-up of fifteen. His time was 4:34.

Another Nebraskan who acquitted himself well was Lawson, in the two-mile run. He finished sixth in a field of fifteen.

Choppy Rhodes, Nebraska entry in the high jump, went out at five feet, ten inches. The final high jump in this event was six feet, three and a half inches, equalling the Valley record.

The mile relay, which Nebraska won, was about the most exciting relay race of the three years of the indoor meet according to some of those who saw the meet. The race was hotly contested with Kansas. Nebraska pulled away to a good lead early in the race, and then, in the third relay, Locke widened the gap between Cornhusker and Jayhawk colors to a full fifteen yards. Fisher, anchor man on the Kansas team, made a desperate effort to overcome the Nebraska lead, but was unable to pass Dailey, who finished about two yards ahead of him.

A mistake was made yesterday in the Big Ten javelin standings account. Wostoupal is first in this event, with a record throw of 166 feet, 2 inches. Popelar is second with 165 feet, and Johnson is third with 160 feet, 10 inches.

When Nebraska meets Stanford University April 4 in the dual meet at Palo Alto, the Huskers will compete with a track team which has gone through three outdoor meets. The Stanford track team met the Olympic Club tracksters in their first outdoor meet on March 14. Last Saturday they had a dual meet with the University of Southern California. This coming Saturday they will meet Oregon University.
