NINETY ENTRANTS IN KANSAS RELAYS

Third Annual Meet Will Be Held Saturday in K. U. Stadium.

LAWRENCE, Kans., April 14.—More than ninety institutions are entered in the third annual University of Kansas relays to be held at Memorial Stadium here Saturday, April 18, it was announced after a final checking up of entry blanks following the closing of entries on April 8.

Twenty-two institutions will send athletes for the university class events, thirty-five for college class relays, and the others are in relay races for high schools.

The institutions entered represent fourteen states and extend from Pennsylvania on the east to California and Oregon on the west and from Minnesota on the north to Texas on the south.

The university class entries are: Creighton of Omaha; Drake of Des Moines; Illinois, Iowa State; Iowa University; Kansas State Agricultural College; Kansas University; Marquette University; Minnesota; Missouri; Nebraska; Grinnell College; Notre Dame; Northwestern; Oklahoma University; Oklahoma A. & M.; Oregon State Agricultural College; University of Pennsylvania; Texas A. & M.; Texas University; and Wisconsin.

College Class entries are: Baker University; Burleson College of Greenville, Tex.; Butler University; Oklahoma Central State Teachers; Cornell College of Mount Vernon, Ia.; Des Moines University; Drury College, Springfield, Mo.; College of Emporia; Fairmount College, Wichita, Kans.; Haskell Indian Institute; Kansas State Teachers of Emporia; Kansas Teachers of Pittsburg; Marysville, (Mo.) State Teachers College; McKendree College, Lebanon, Ill.

ANNOUNCE EXAMINATIONS

Civil Service Commission Will Fill Vacancies

The United States Civil Service Commission announces the following open competitive examinations to fill vacancies in the department of Economics: home economics specialist, \$3,800 a year, associate home economics specialist, \$3,000 a year, and assistant home economics specialist, \$2,400 a year. Applications for these positions will be accepted until May 12.

Competitors will not be required to report for examination at any place, but will be rated on their education, training, and experience, and a thesis or publication to be filed with the application.

In addition to these positions, the Commission offers an examination for the position of Junior Home Economics Specialist, at \$1,860 a year. Those who enter will be rated on practical questions, a thesis to be delivered to the examiner on the day of the examination, education, training and experience. Applications will not be accepted later than May 9.

Full information and application blanks may be obtained from the United States Civil Service Commission, Washington, D. C., or the secretary of the board of U. S. civil-service examiners at the post office or custom house in any city.
