There are fifty more pages in the 1925 Cornhusker than in any previous volume, several new sections being added. The highest grade paper was used, more money was spent than ever before and everything has been done which could add to the success of the annual.
The alumni section is a new section and contains about one hundred pictures of prominent alumni, and short writeups telling where they are and what they are doing. The student life section, called "Mirrors of Nebraska" is nearly completed and will be one of the most interesting sections of the book.
