'I believe the army and the navy should be retained by every nation, not so much as a defense, but as furnishing the best

machinery of education. I believe in military training not only for every boy, but for every girl. This military training in no sense implies training to murder to developing the lust to kill. But it does imply certain things that are of more necessity for youth than other things that can be supplied elsewhere. The child learns best by military training the meaning of discipline and perhaps more souls are lost and bodies ruined by lack of discipline than by any other cause.

'The child, by military training, has developed in him a sense of responsibility and this is the core of good citizenship..... If he learns "jingoism" and the bunk about the glory of war and conquest it is not because this sort of rubbish is in anywise essential to military training. Military training does not imply that those who receive it shall become professional soldiers.'
