

HUSKERS HONORED AT SUMMER CAMP

Students and Instructors Alike Excel in Military Ability at Fort Des Moines.

High honors were won this summer by men from Nebraska at the Fort Des Moines military camp. Student W. Keith Miller, of Lincoln, a sophomore in the Nebraska R. O. T. C. won two silver loving cups as the best student from Nebraska, and the best all-around infantry student at the camp. Capt. Floyd C. Harding, instructor in the military department commanded the company that won the cup for the best garrison unit. Captain Ira A. Hunt commanded the company that established a new camp record in rifle marksmanship. Capt. K. M. Still, of Lincoln, a graduate of the Nebraska R. O. T. C. had the best company at camp in

field service. Reserve Lieutenant James F. Miller, also a graduate of Nebraska, was leader of the best platoon in camp.

Captain Victor G. Huska, instructor of juniors at Nebraska, commanded the company that finished second in rifle marksmanship. Lieutenant Francis B. Millson, another graduate of Nebraska led the platoon that placed second in the battalion competition. Captain Harding's company also finished second in field service.

At the Citizens camp at Fort Snelling first place in rifle marksmanship competition was won by a company composed in part of Nebraska men.

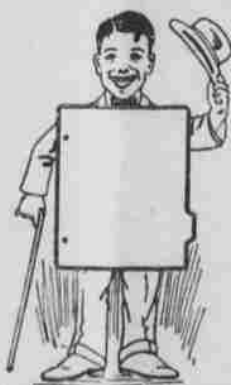
