eral Arts and enter a more specialized group has ceased and that the two colleges are now in condition of equilibrium.

Dentistry, which has shown a loss in previous years owing to changes in the curriculum, now shows a normal increase.

Engineering shows an increase of about eight per cent. This reflects the demand by the country for engineers for public works, roads, and various industrial enterprises.

In the graduate College there is an increase showing that more of the people of the state are finding time and inclination to pursue studies for advanced degrees.

The Law College shows a slight increase, notwithstanding that its policy has been to discourage excessive numbers and constantly improve quality.

In the College of Pharmacy there has been a decrease in the freshman class because the two-year course has been abandoned. At the same time, the numbers in the second, third, and fourth year classes are larger; so that, while the number remains constant, the students are of higher quality.

Teacher's Has Largest Increase.

The Teachers College has an increase of 197 students. This is the largest increase in any of the Colleges and shows that the tendency of those desiring to teach to register in a professional college for teachers is still operating. A recent act of the legislature simplifying the certification laws facilitated the obtaining of licenses to teach by students in colleges other than Teachers College. This law properly required certain work in the Teachers College but did not require for state certificates registration in the college. The University officials were somewhat in doubt as to how this would affect registration; but it would seem that the majority of students who expect to teach desire state teachers' certificates issued from the University rather than a certificate from the office of the state superintendent.

In none of these schools or colleges has there been any special effort made to increase registration. For a good many years the increase in students has been, in view of rising prices, in excess of available support. The University has been more desirous of improving the quality of students than increasing the numbers.

The Medical College shows a decrease of approximately sixty students. This college has a course covering six year above the high school and last spring it graduated a very large class of those who came in immediately after the war. Last year registration was considerably larger than the plant was designed to accommodate. A number of poorer students were weeded out during the year and only the better students applying for admission were received. The college still has a higher registration than any medical colleges having a much greater physical plant.

### Offer New Course In Fine Arts This Term

A new orientation class in the School of Fine Arts is being offered this term by Assistant Professor Emily G. Moore, who spent the summer in Chicago studying the system introduced by the Carnegie Corporation for such instruction. The course will carry one hour credit and is designed to give some idea of the field of art in general without entering into any phase intensively.

It will include lectures on analysis of pictures, use of color, Italian and Northern painting, Greek, Renaissance and modern sculpture, impression, contemporary American painting, Gothic cathedrals, and the development of modern architecture. Similar courses are being introduced this year at the University of Minnesota, Grinnell College, Northwestern University, DePauw University, Wooster College (Ohio), Miami University (Ohio), Carleton College (Minnesota), Berea College (Kentucky), and Knox College (Illinois).
