INTEGRATED COURSES

Under a title "A Correlated and Integrated Course of Study" the catalog of Reed College (Portland, Oregon) comments on the arrangement of its plan as follows: "The student is encouraged to look upon his work as forming one course of study, not a group of courses of study."

Most students take a given amount of "general" work before they enter professional colleges. The prospective law students spend from two to four years in the College of Arts and Science; and so do others.

For the student who spends four years in these general subjects, the loss is greater since more potential results are unattained. Such a student may be utterly uneducated by taking an unorganized jumble of courses.

To prevent the waste of disorganization means should be provided to either force the student to take a well ordered and integrated series of courses, or he should be carefully advised if students were to be advised, merely, their subjects would have to be selected with care are supplementary readings required to unify them.
