Dean Lyman Is Asked To Talk at Meeting

Dean R. A. Lyman of the College of Pharmacy has been asked by the executive committee of the National Association of Pharmacy Licensing boards to lead in the discussion of a classification for pharmacy schools when the association meets in Philadelphia the second week in September. The Association of American Colleges of Pharmacy will meet jointly.

At present there is no designation in the association to designate the highest standing members, as is the case with medical schools. It has proved to be a problem to examining boards and pharmacy schools. Under the new plan Dean Lyman hopes to have the schools classed in grades of A, B, and C.
