Student season athletic tickets will go on sale at three o'clock this afternoon at the Coliseum, Students representing organizations are required to bring with them a list of the members desiring tickets. The price of the book is \$8.50.

At least three thousand tickets will be sold during the sales campaign, predicts John K. Selleck, business manager of athletics. No sales campaign will be conducted on the campus, as the reduced price is not an inducement to sell more tickets but a privilege granted to students. The special price is a reduction of nearly fifteen dollars from the regular single admission prices to the various athletic events during the

Only football tickets are being placed in the books. When the football season is over the student can exchange his book for one containing reserved seat tickets for basketball, and general tickets for wrestling and track. Thus the student has the opportunity of choosing his reserved seat for the basketball season in the Coliseum.

The athletic department has set aside the choice seats in the east stand of the stadium to provide a cheering section and to promote the Cornhusker spirit by grouping the students together.
